**October 2011 is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month  
A Special Message about Free Services to Reduce Breast Cancer  
in the African-American Communities of Illinois**

There is a place in America where a certain group of women are dying every day of a disease that, if caught early, in many cases can be curable. In this same exact place, there lives another group of women who tragically are also dying from this same curable disease –but fortunately much less often.

Women from the first group are dying at a rate on average 62% higher than the second group of women. There is a 62% difference in how often which women are living and which are dying.

Where is this place? What is this disease that does not have to always kill but keeps killing? Who are these women and why are they still dying?

The place is Chicago, Illinois. The disease is Breast Cancer. The women who are dying at a higher rate are African American women from all walks of life and health backgrounds. The women who are not dying as often are white women who also live in Chicago, according to the most recent study released by the Sinai Urban Institute of Mt. Sinai Hospital. Tragically, it is not only African American women in Chicago who are at risk of dying but also those who live throughout Illinois.

The answers to the next 2 questions are the most important for today's special message. Why are black women still dying at such a higher rate, and what can be done about it to stop the killing?

Not enough of our women are getting screened/tested for breast cancer every year like they should. Not enough are doing self breast exams regularly to check to see if everything is alright between doctor visits. And, sometimes the wait for a doctor's appointment is too long. The location for the testing may not be close to home. And, treatment is very expensive if you don't have health insurance.

What can we do today, right now to protect the health and life of our beloved mothers, daughters, sisters, aunts, cousins, girlfriends, neighbors, co-workers and church members? Tell every woman in your life to please get screened/tested for breast cancer. If they don't have insurance and are 40 to 64 years of age, the State of Illinois can provide free screening and free or low cost treatment. Just call Illinois Women's Health-line at 1-888- 522-1282. Tell them today and remind them every day. Go with them or call to see if they went. Now, please tell the person next to you to go tell someone to tell someone to get tested for breast cancer.

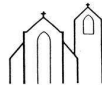
